AACCUP results revealed a total of 21 accredited programs including those with candidate status. The Target of 10 programs for Level 1 did not materialized; instead accomplished 8 programs with candidate status. This was due to the delays in the survey visits as we only depend on AACCUPs accommodation on our application. In fact, AACCUP, in its 2013 General Assembly, made pronouncements that they are fully booked until December 2013. This was the reason why CSU only applied in late 2013 for February 2014 visit but AACCUP accommodated us only in July and October 2014. Furthermore, actual accomplishments computation is based on the accredited programs/ accreditable programs. The capability of AACCUP to facilitate the accreditation scheduling of the 110 SUCs member should also be taken into consideration, and to consider further the pacing of accreditation schedules established by AACCUP. • It is further appealed that consideration be given since CSU is a recipient of Certificate of Recognition from AACCUP on the following awards: |

The University's accomplishment exceeds the target by 236 due to the number of clients served by the College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources (CASNR) and the CSU-Cabadbaran Campus (CSUCC). The clients of CASNR are those attending seminars and workshops related to crop and livestock production technologies while those of CSUCC are in line with the campus' extension activities in La Union, Cabadbaran City. |

Moreover, there are many scholarship grants from CHED, DOST, DA and from other funding institutions that are open to teaching personnel and same grants provide funds for substitution in the absence of the one who went on study leave. For CY 2014, there is the presence of a total of 19 teaching personnel and 2 non-teaching personnel pursuing their graduate degrees. |
